GENERAL CONDUCT RULES

Be Respectful

Respect the hotel, hotel staff, AnimeFargo staff, and respect others staying at the hotel.

Pick up after yourself and be mindful of the hotel property.

Follow staff member instructions.

Wear your Badge

Wear your badge between your head and waist and keep it visible at all times. If you enter a convention area without a badge you will be asked to leave.

Obey the Law

All local, state and federal laws must be observed. If it's illegal outside the convention, it's illegal inside the convention. This includes underage drinking: the drinking age is 21.

Observe Curfew Hours

Keep the noise levels down overnight – others may be trying to sleep!

Please note the hotel's curfew hours in the Hotel Rules section below.

Lost Items

If you find something that isn't yours, take it to ConOps (Room 174). If you're missing something, check ConOps.

Emergencies

In the event of an emergency, call 911. You may ask convention staff or hotel staff for assistance as well.

Above All: Have Fun!

HOTEL RULES

Please be respectful of hotel property and staff. We don't want anything broken, and we're sure you don't want to be responsible for something being broken. Just keep in mind that we're all guests at the hotel, and we want them to keep loving us!

Only use painter's tape (any brand will do) to hang posters and things like that around the convention. Anything else will be (carefully) taken down. Again, we don't want to break the hotel!

Please note that curfew hours for the city of Fargo are between 11pm and 6am. Minors (any person under age 16) are not allowed to be in a public space without a parent or guardian during this time (this includes the public spaces of the hotel). See City of Fargo Ordinances, Article 10-0104.

ACCESSIBILITY & INCLUSION

Anime Fargo strives to be accessible to our con goers. We offer a variety of accommodations, such as priority seating, large print program guides, a quiet room, and more. If you are in need of any assistance please ask to speak to the accessibility head. We also are inclusive of the LGBTQIA2S+ community. Gender neutral bathrooms are located across from Walnut. Pronoun stickers are available at Registration.

COSPLAY & WEAPONS POLICY

Anime Fargo staff members have the final say on whether something is appropriate.

If it's illegal outside the con, it's illegal inside the con.

AnimeFargo reserves the right to change our policies at any time. That being said, we want all congoers to have fun and be able to proudly display their costumes!

For the purposes of this policy, a "costume" includes all parts of a cosplay, including clothing, accessories, props, etc.

- Badges must be visible at all times, regardless of your costume/dress. Please wear your badge somewhere on your torso (between neck and waist).
- Shoes must be worn at all times. This is a hygiene issue, as well as common sense. Socks and bare feet are not permitted.
- Costumes must cover the "private" areas of the body.
- Remember, this is a family-friendly convention, and there will be children present. Profane language or symbols as part of a costume or printed on normal clothing will not be tolerated.
- Be tasteful with regards to clothing that may be religiously or governmentally offensive in any way.
- Cosplayers are asked to be mindful of the radius of their costumes and props. Some cosplays can be large and elaborate. However, if you are unintentionally (or intentionally) taking out other congoers left and right (for example, with a sword/ staff or large stiff wig), you will be asked to retire the offending item or costume.
- No projectiles are allowed. This includes operating airsoft guns, filled water guns, and NERF gun darts.

- Any weapon props must be visibly peace bound.
- Live steel is permissible, but it must be peace bonded into the sheath. If there is no way to bind it into the sheath it is NOT allowed in the con space. It CANNOT come out of the sheath at any time during the convention. If it is found that you have broken your peace bond and unsheathed your live steel you will be spoken to by safety.
- Any projectile weapons must be unfireable. How this is accomplished is up to the attendee. Some actions that will achieve this goal may include removing the firing mechanism, removing the firing pin, or making the slide/magazine load nonfunctioning. All projectile weapons will be peace bonded with a zip tie in such a fashion that the trigger cannot be pulled, as an added safety measure. If the peace bond is found to be removed, you will be directed to safety.
- All non steel and non projectile weapons or props must be peace tied. This will be done with a non permanent marking in a visible location on the prop that indicates that your prop has been approved by safety to be in the convention space. Once again, if a peace tie is found to have been removed you will be directed to safety.
- Consequences for removing a peace tie/peace bond will be determine depending on the type of weapon or prop, any actions involving the prop/weapon in question, and whether you have been previously approached in regards to the issue.
- Consequences are at the discretion of convention safety and chairs. All decisions made will be non negotiable and final.

Anyone deemed to violate these policies will be asked to change or leave the convention by a staff member.

AnimeFargo fully believes that **COSPLAY IS NOT CONSENT.** Please be respectful of your fellow congoers.

We have no tolerance for harassment.

REGISTRATION

Registration is your first stop at Anime Fargo! You can pick up or purchase a convention badge at the registration table, plus snag a fun lanyard and add your preferred pronoun.

If you pre-registered, your badge is ready for you at the registration desk. Please provide the Eventeny QR code or confirmation number to pick up your badge.

If you'd like to purchase a badge, we accept all major credit cards and cash as payment.

All con attendees must have a badge! All con attendees must wear their badge at all times while in con-run areas: Vendors & Artists Alley, Panels, Events, eGaming, Tabletop Gaming, Cosplay Contest, etc.

We do not offer limited-access badges, including parent or shopper badges. If you have questions about our badge policy please contact Registration staff.

Registration is located just outside of Con Operations, Room 174.

COSPLAY CONTEST

It's no secret that cosplaying is a core part of a great convention, so of course we at Anime Fargo are more than happy to host a cosplay contest for all of our registrants! Please see below for information about this year's cosplay contest as well as general guidelines for the contest.

Anime Fargo 2023 Cosplay Contest Information and Policies

1. Sign Up

Sign Up and Liability Forms will be available on Friday near registration. Submitting a form is an agreement that you will participate in the Anime Fargo Cosplay Competition on Saturday of Anime Fargo weekend. **Sign-ups at con** will only be available 2:00p - 7:30p on Friday.

2. Orientation

All entrants are required to attend the AnimeFargo Cosplay Contest Orientation at 10:00 am Saturday morning in Main Programming. If you do not attend, or show up after we take attendance, you will not be allowed to partake in the contest. During Orientation we will go over Rules and Guidelines, give out times for Rehearsal and Workmanship Judging, and answer any remaining questions. Please bring a pen and paper for any questions you may have.

3. Rehearsal

Rehearsal times will be given during Orientation and will take place in Main Programming. Please be on time for rehearsal. Again, if you are not present after we take attendance, you will not be allowed to partake in the contest. Rehearsal will be your time to practice getting on and off stage, setting your marks with the tech crew and hearing the MC announce your entry. **Please arrive in full costume.**

4. Workmanship Judging

Workmanship judging will be happening at the same time as rehearsals. If you have chosen to have your costume judged, you will be given a time slot at Orientation. Judging will happen in Cedar and Elm. Woodland North is where the rehearsal and contest will take place. Workmanship judging is optional, but strongly encouraged!

5. Green Room (Elm)

All entrants are required to be in the Workmanship Judging room no later than 40 minutes before the show starts. Exact time will be specified at Orientation. Please check-in with the Cosplay Contest staff when you arrive. All entrants are to arrive in full costume and makeup. Special consideration may be provided to entrants with difficult costumes if notice is given to event staff prior to the event. Once checked in, entrants are assigned to an area and a staff member will be in the room to answer any questions. All entrants are required to follow the direction of event staff once checked in and are asked not to leave for the duration of the event. Please be aware that the Green Room is not the biggest, so leave any excess bags and items in your hotel room. Makeup and Sewing Kits are okay.

6. Disallowed Cosplays

A costume or uniform recreating or resembling any local, state, or federal law enforcement will not be allowed. If you cannot provide proof that you are a law enforcement officer you will be asked to change.

COSPLAY CONTEST CONT'D

Prohibited From the Green Room

- Individuals not competing in the event (excluding guardians supervising minors)
- Any food (please eat beforehand)
- Drinks other than water (water must be in bottles)
- Leaving without staff acknowledgement



CHARITY AUCTION



Anime Fargo is proud to support HERO, the Healthcare Equipment Recycling Organization, as its 2023 charity.

In 1996, a group of operating room nurses researched a method of safely recycling health care supplies and presented their project to F-M area healthcare facilities. The providers, who were once forced to discard opened packages because of the cost and liability of reprocessing, found the alternative of recycling very attractive. Now they could reduce costly medical waste expenses and help others at the same time. HERO was born from that cooperative project and the number of agencies, health care facilities, and individuals joining the effort to recycle medical supplies continued to multiply.

Through the efforts of a dedicated HERO board, staff, and an army of volunteers, HERO has grown exponentially since its humble beginnings of operation out of a garage.

The message of collecting, recycling, and distributing durable medical supplies resonated with the community, allowing HERO to grow and expand its services and operation.

HERO proudly operates a retail space of 1200 square feet located at 5012 53rd St S, Ste C in south Fargo. Our warehouse storage includes 1500 square feet with future plans to expand and improve.

TABLETOP GAMING

Welcome to Tabletop Gaming, (literally) the coolest room at Anime Fargo! Feel free to stop by at any time during our open hours to pull out a game from our collection to play with your friends or ask our staff to teach you how to play a game that looks interesting. Rumor has it that a Ninja Master may be taking up residence in Tabletop Gaming on Saturday and Sunday if you wish to challenge him - so long as our Grunkle isn't actively running another event!



<u>Friday</u>

Learn to Play - Red Dragon Inn: You may have heard in years past of the Red Dragon Inn Tournament that is held on Saturday of the convention; if you have, this is a session that will teach you how to play this rip-roaring game so you can participate in the Tournament on Saturday. You do not need to be available for the entire time block and may come and go as you please.

Splendor Tournament: (Max 8 players; sign up early) Splendor is a game of chip-collecting and card development. You are a merchant of the Renaissance and trying to win enough prestige to have a Noble visit your estate and recognize your prowess. Single-elimination; Prize for 1st Place.

Paranoia - Truth or Dare: (Max 5 players; sign up early) Paranoia is a humorous "zap-style" Role-playing game (you have 6 lives - expect to die, a lot) taking place in the far future in an underground complex run by an insane AI (the computer IS your friend, citizen.) This mission will answer the question: Is treason committed while undercover still treasonous?

<u>Saturday</u>

Learn to Play - Red Dragon Inn (See above)

Red Dragon Inn Tournament: You've killed the dungeon boss, you've brought home all the treasure, and you've upgraded all your gear, so what do you do with the 10 gold left to your name? Buy drinks for your friends at the Red Dragon Inn, of course! A non-alcoholic "Drinking" game where the last player with gold standing is the winner. This Tournament is Single Elimination. Happy brawling!

Dungeons & Dragons 5e - The Rescue of Princess McGuffin: A one-shot adventure for 5e that hits many of the classic D&D Tropes. 2nd level characters can be built in advance with any WotC published source books. Point buy or Standard Array, No starting magic items; Generically generic characters will be available if you don't have the time or inclination to build your own! Dice can be provided.

<u>Sunday</u>

Character Building and Learning to Play D&D 5e: Sooo....what's this Dungeons and Dragons thing all about? How do you play? What's with all the different funky dice? We'll be sitting down with all your questions and building characters together, then, if you have time left over, a roleplaying session will follow with the Sandpoint Festival. Literally no experience or materials expected or required.

Dungeons & Dragons 5e - The Sandpoint Festival: A beautiful coastal fall day and the end of the harvest bringing the community together for a day of fun activities like pie eating, pig wrasslin, and pin the tail on the mayor! An introductory session to D&D 5e for new players. Preference will be given to new players for this session.

RAY CHASE



Ray Chase is best known for his versatility as a voice actor in video games, animation, and feature films. He's played countless protagonists in JRPGs, starting with Noctis in Final Fantasy XV (2016), and brought his same cinematic energy to Brother Nier in NieR Replicant: ver.1.22474487139... (2021), and Alphen in Tales of Arise (2021). On the flip side he's played wildly different and iconic roles such as brave Roy in Super Smash Bros. Ultimate (2018), evil Sukuna in Jujutsu Kaisen (2020), the corporate Rhys Strongfork in Borderlands 3 (2019), the devious Master of Masters in Kingdom Hearts III (2019), mafioso Bruno Bucciarati in Jolo's Bizarre Adventure (2012), and the flamboyant Puri Puri Prisoner in One Punch Man (2015).

He got his start making YouTube videos and working on audiobooks, narrating over a hundred before setting his sights on breaking into voice acting. After getting some small roles in anime, his first big break came with Noctis in 2016. After making dozens of appearances in more anime and games, he's begun to break into feature films. In 2021, director James Wan chose him to give voice to the sinister Gabriel in Malignant (2021), imbuing the antagonist with dramatic flair.

He is a con fixture making appearances all over the world with his show "Loud, Annoying, and Very Annoying" (LAVA) with fellow voice actors Robbie Daymond and Max Mittelman. They stream weekly on Twitch playing games they have made appearances in.

MORGAN BERRY

Morgan Berry is a professional voice actor, singer, and YouTuber; best known for her voice roles in various anime television series, films, video games, and web series. Some of the many franchises Morgan has voiced for include: "Pokemon", "Dragon Ball", "Beyblade", "My Hero Academia", "Final Fantasy", "Inuyasha", "Fire Emblem", "Miraculous Ladybug", "Sword Art Online", "One Piece", "Fruits Basket", "Food Wars", "Tokyo Ghoul", "Borderlands", "Love Live!", "Smite", "Overlord", "The Rising of the Shield Hero", "Marvel Avengers Academy", "Cells at Work", the award winning film "The Boy and the Beast", and many more. Morgan has worked with many prestigious companies including Disney, Nintendo, Cartoon Network / Adult Swim, Marvel Entertainment, SEGA, Square Enix, Netflix, Crunchyroll / Funimation, Rooster Teeth, Bandai Namco, Gearbox Software, Sanrio, Team Four Star, and various other notable establishments





PAUL ST. PETER



Paul St. Peter, twice nominated for BTVA Awards, is a voice actor from Los Angeles, whose many anime and video game credits include KINGDOM HEARTS (Xemnas), NARUTO (Nine Tail Fox), ONE PUNCH MAN (Beast King), DIGIMON (Wormmon, Leomon), ROBOTECH (Zor Prime), BLEACH (Yammy Riyalgo), WORLD OF WARCRAFT (Boden The Imposing), DYNASTY WARRIORS I-IV (Yuan Shao), DIGIMON: THE MOVIE (Kokomon), ZETMAN (Sugito), MAJIN (Majin), TESTIMONY OF THE NEW SHE DEVIL (Valga), BERSERK (Grunbeld), MIRACULOUS LADYBUG (Master Fu), GODZILLA III (Takeshi), LUPIN Pt.5 (Mamo), and RESIDENT EVIL 5 (Swahili Zombie). Paul does comical voices too, from WORMMON (Digimon Warriors) to PUNCH (Cowboy Bebop).

Among his other game, anime, and feature anime credits are GURREN LAGAAN (Jorgun), THE COUNT OF MONTE CRISTO, (Mondego), MONSTER (Dr. Reichwein), PAPRIKA (Konakawa), LUPIN III: THE SECRET OF MAMO (Mamo), DURARARA (Higa), X-COM (Dr. Heinrich), BATTLE B-DAMON (Armada), DIABLO III (Demented Spirit), and DEFIANCE (Burgess). Paul's voice can also be heard on such titles as MONSTER STRIKE (Death Panda), DRAKENGARD III (Michael The Dragon), JOJO'S BIZARRE ADVENTURES (Wamuu, Dire, Jack The Ripper), NARUTO 7: ULTIMATE NINJA STORM (Kurama), THE SEVEN DEADLY SINS (Armor Giant), AJIN (Hirasawa), HEARTHSTONE (Igneous Giant), KILLER (Colonel Derick) YS VIII: LACRIMOSA OF DANA (Sahad), ACE COMBAT 7 (various roles), GUNDAM: IRON BLOODED ORPHANS (McMurdo), DRAGON BALL SUPER (Sorbet), HUNTER HUNTER (Razor), LITTLE TIARAS (Oak), IRON 17 (Ionnias IX), MEGALO BOX (Burroughs), and SAINT SEIYA (Hakurei).

A versatile performer, Paul also sang for four seasons with the San Diego Opera Company, three years with the Civic Light Opera, and appeared in several productions at the Old Globe Theatre. In Los Angeles, Paul has acted at the Globe Playhouse, Richard Basehart Theatre, Palos Verde Shakespeare on The Meadow, performed with the Rogue Artists, and has "gone on the road" for eleven seasons with the Nevada Shakespeare Festival. As an instructor, Paul has taught speech, accents, dialects, phonetics, vocal production, and Shakespeare at The American Academy of Dramatic Arts, California State University Los Angeles, San Diego State University, Los Angeles Broadcasting School, the Windward School, and is a speech and acting coach for Native Voices at the Autry, a Native American Theatre company, and for the Rogue Artists.

Paul's TV appearances include work on NCIS, LAST MAN STANDING, JESSIE, LEGIT (for FX), RINGER, TIM AND ERIC'S AWESOME SHOW (Great Job!), and the hilarious KEY AND PEELE (Comedy Central.)

SAPPHIRE

Sapphire is a YouTube singer, translyricist and sound mixer, with a full, powerful and mature voice in the higher ranges.

She mainly sings English renditions of anime songs and her most popular solo cover is her English cover of the Kill la Kill opening "Sirius", with over 158K views on YouTube as of May 2014.

On occasion, she commissions musicians to record instrumental versions of anime songs which were never given official instrumental versions.

Sapphire has often collaborated with Y. Chang, and many other YouTubers, including Apatheria, Rikatwoo, Merr, and Steven Kelly. They have made appearances in her songs, as well as in her webcomic fandubs.

In addition to singing anime songs, she also does fandubs for webcomics.



THE KAMIKAZE SNOWMEN



The Kamikaze Snowmen originally began in 1993 as a fun improvisational pastime between three junior high friends. The group evolved in the late 1990s-early 2000s into an indie comedy band, recording albums and playing live shows at coffee houses and college campus events. In the 2010s the Snowmen found a kinship with comedians and a home at conventions. Over the years they've grown their repertoire to include comedy showcases, hosting opening/closing ceremonies and cosplay contests, moderating panels with other guests, game shows, trivia, music video shoots, and more. The group now consists of primary members Paul Tebben and Josh Trumbo, with alum Terry Bown II still appearing on album tracks when able. Taking cues from classic vaudeville and adapting various pop-culture landmarks into their music, The Kamikaze Snowmen provide inclusive and interactive content perfect for any convention setting.

Taking place after the Cosplay Contest, you are invited to take a seat in the Velvet Lounge as Sapphire serenades us into the night with her musical talents and powerful vocals as she sings cover songs from anime and video games! **No requests please.**

Traditional Japanese Martial Arts Demo

Saturday 2:00p - 3:30p, Main Programming

Demonstration of Kendo (Japanese fencing), laido (Japanese swordsmanship), Jodo (sword vs stick), and Kenjutsu (sword vs sword). In kendo, practitioners wear armor and try to score points using bamboo sword (shinai). laido is the art of drawing and cutting with a Japanese katana (sword). In iaido, a practitioner executes set forms, or kata, against one or multiple imaginary opponents. Each kata describes how a swordsman should respond to a specific situation, such as when you encounter a surprise attack from an opponent seated in front of you or an attack from multiple opponents as you are walking. At the Agassiz Dojo we practice the approved All Japan Kendo Federation seitei iaido katas, as well as the older koryu Musoshindenryu. There are 12 seitei kata, and close to 50 of the MSR kata. There are 12 Jodo kata, and additionally 10 kenjutsu kata. It's a lot! Students wear traditional "hakama" uniforms, and practice with either a wooden sword called a bokuto, or with a dull-bladed katana called an iaito. The instructor, Bradley Anderson, currently holds the rank of 5dan iaido, and 3dan in jodo, Idan in kendo and practices with an authentic (sharp) Japanese-made katana.

<u> Chunin Exams - Conwide Event</u>

All day, everywhere

Do you have what it takes to pass the Chunin Exams? Through a series of tests and challenges, you and your clan will test your mettle to see if you can prove your skills! To start your mission, you must prove you can be aware of your surroundings before proceeding into the more dangerous missions. Attend Opening Ceremonies, or, if you happened to sleep through that, find our exam proctors by heading to Registration or wandering around convention for more information on starting your ninja journey! The proctors will be wearing black headbands with a star symbol.

A testing portion will be held on each day of Anime Fargo and challenges are open on the following hours:

- Friday 5pm-8pm
- Saturday 9am-9pm
- Sunday 9am-12pm

Note that clan leaders are unavailable during the costume festival (cosplay contest).

CHUNIN EXAMS EVENT

Stage One: Throughout the convention spaces, you will find ninja scrolls hidden to test your awareness of your surroundings. Each applicant for the Ninja Exam must bring two scrolls to the exam proctors to prove that they are ready for the challenge section of the exam. Ninja applicants who cheat by keeping the scrolls preventing others from a fair shot may face expulsion from the exam.

Stage Two: Once an applicant has proven that they are aware of their surroundings, the proctor will give them their admission ribbon for the exam. Now you can prove your abilities by locating three of the seven ninja masters and issuing a challenge! Each ninja master has their own specialty so make sure you choose wisely. Keep an eye out for the ninja masters by looking for their clan headbands! Once you have challenged three ninja masters follow up with the exam proctors to receive your ribbon.

Stage Three: Once you have passed the Chunin exam, you will have the opportunity to continue your journey and achieve your Jonin status. Find the primary exam proctor to be given the final challenge.

Clan v Clan: Throughout the convention there will be the opportunity for clan v clan challenges. These challenges will be to further your clan's standing in the Ninja Academy. These clan challenges will be held once a day during the convention during the Ninja Exam panel.

PvP: When you receive your admission ribbon, you may also choose your challenge status (challenge, ask or closed). This status declares your openness to be challenged by other attendees. The challenged opponent may select the challenge to be completed. To complete the challenge, it must be proctored by a member of Anime Fargo staff, the winner will receive a ticket to turn in to the exam proctors to have the challenge and results recorded.




